# New Federal **TEACH** Grants

Graduate Studies for Teachers in Denver Public Schools



**Award amount: A maximum of \$4,000 per year for a total of \$8,000**

You may qualify if you:

- Intend to teach full-time for at least 4 years in schools serving low-income students following graduation
- Enroll as a student in the University of Colorado Denver's School of Education & Human Development in the Master's program in Curriculum & Instruction with an emphasis or endorsement in:
  - **Secondary Math**
  - **Secondary Science**
  - **Reading Teacher**
  - **Linguistically Diverse Education**
- Or an M.A. in:
  - **Special Education**
- You don't need to demonstrate financial need. But you do need to complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA). The FAFSA is available at [www.fafsa.ed.gov](http://www.fafsa.ed.gov).
