Programs and Services We Offer

Volunteer Partners Program (VPP) - Many faces, many voices! You are important to us. This is an opportunity for our families, community members and business partners to be involved in decision making and to serve as advocacy (support) for our students.

Family Focus Groups (FFG) – For families who are not comfortable coming to school, or cannot come because of transportation or child care barriers, family focus group sessions can be held in neighborhood homes, community centers, churches, businesses, or even a restaurant.

Community Learning Center (CLC) - Providing parents, families, students, and community with access to valuable academic, co-curricular, recreational, health, social services, workforce-preparation computer training and educational resources.
